#### **BC Teacher's Strike**

On June 17, 2014, teachers in British Columbia began strike action as a result of ongoing contract disputes between the BC teachers federation (BCTF) and the government of BC. The main issues in this labour action are relating to class size and composition as well as wages. The BC supreme court has already ruled against the government relating to bargaining in bad faith, and has directed the government to bargain issues of class size and composition in this set of negotiations. Despite this legal directive, the government of BC is choosing to battle with the BCTF and is stating that the teachers want to stay "in their own orbit" with regards to these issues. BC teachers are among the lowest paid in Canada, and BC is suffering from a

"brain drain" in which qualified teachers are leaving BC to find better wages, working conditions and benefits elsewhere.

How do this affect us? We have many members who work in Alberta/NWT and live in BC. This is also an example of what governments can do anywhere in this country and why we as citizens and voters need to be aware of what is going on around us. Many of our members have children or grandchildren in the school systems across Canada, and the quality of the education of the next generations must be of the utmost importance.
